Something like 287BC to 212BC. Son of Phidias the astronomer, he was also an astronomer, plus he was a mathematician, physicist, engineer and inventor.



He was responsible for ... *deep breath* proving the area of a circle, the surface area and volume of a sphere and the area under a parabola; an accurate approximation of the value of pi; an explanation of the principle of the lever; the invention of the screw pump and compound pulleys; defensive war machines such as the heat ray; and much, much more.
